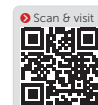

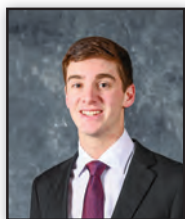

REMEMBERING OUR DAD

It is with heavy hearts that we share the passing of our family's patriarch and the founder of Farnear Holsteins, Joe Simon. Joe dedicated his life to his family, his community, and the dairy industry. In the 1950s, he helped local dairy farmers by starting a milk hauling business, providing them with a vital outlet for their milk. In 1962, he founded Farnear Holsteins. From the beginning, his guiding philosophy was simple: use the best available sires as the key to genetic improvement. That principle still guides us today.

Dad faithfully served as our parish cemetery caretaker for more than 70 years. He was a longtime 4-H leader and is a member of the Iowa 4-H Hall of Fame.

He served in leadership roles with both local and state Holstein associations, and in 2001, proudly co-chaired the National Holstein Convention hosted in Iowa. For many years he also served as a delegate to the national convention. Together with our mom, Virginia, his wife of 71 years, he traveled to Holstein conventions across the country, forming lifelong friendships along the way.

Joe and Virginia passed down their love for Holsteins to their children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren, many of whom are active in the Holstein and dairy industries.

Yet, what shaped us most was not only his success in breeding Holsteins, but the values he lived and instilled in us:

Work hard. Be humble. Follow the Golden Rule. Respect others. And above all, "Enjoy life, enjoy your family."

We are deeply grateful for the legacy he leaves behind—
in his family, his community, and the dairy industry he loved.

Sheeknoll Farms BREEDER FEATURE

Bob and Jeannette Sheehan's story began on the St. Paul campus of the University of Minnesota Twin Cities, where their shared love of dairy farming first brought them together. That connection grew into a marriage, a family, and a lifelong commitment to the dairy industry. Today, the Sheehans are proud parents of three married children Kelly (Dan) Kendall of Sauk City, WI, Andrew (Juliana) Sheehan of Rochester, MN, and Krista (Jordan) of Rochester, MN and grandparents to seven active grandchildren. Both Bob and Jeannette grew up with a passion for dairy cattle and knew they wanted to make farming their life's work. After college, Bob began his career in extension before moving into a role as Sire Procurement Manager at Minnesota Valley Breeders. Six years later, in 1984, he returned to Rochester to join his father, Jim, and brothers, Jimmy and Jerome, on the Sheehan family farm. There, the next generation of Sheehans learned the value of hard work and teamwork by being active on the farm alongside their cousins.

This September marks 41 years since Bob and Jeannette made the move back to the family farm. At the time, the couple had only a house on the property. Together, they quickly built a 52-cow tie-stall barn with feed storage, and moved the family over on Thanksgiving weekend. From the start, the Sheehans were focused on building a herd that reflected both function and longevity. "With both of us loving dairy judging and functional cows, we set a goal to milk cows that had high milk production, functional type, strong feet and legs, sound udders, and cows that would last many lactations and pay the bills," Jeannette explained.

The Sheehan family is celebrating their 41st year of dairy farming, a milestone that reflects both on tradi-

tion and progress. Today, the operation spans two sites: a freestall barn managed by two of the Sheehan brothers' families and a tie-stall barn that Bob and Jeannette's family has always overseen. From the beginning, the Sheehans were committed to shaping their herd through their own decisions in genetics, nutrition, and cow management. In the early years, with no outside help, the family worked together to balance farm chores with meetings, school events, and church functions. Now, with the addition of a herd manager and milking staff to handle daily responsibilities, Bob and Jeannette are able to dedicate more time to attending the activities of their seven grandchildren and spending time with family.

Providing wholesome food to feed the world, working with animals, and watching the progress in genetics, nutrition, cow management, and agronomy to create the most efficient cow and milk product are what drive the Sheehan family. Their passion for dairying goes hand in hand with a deep commitment to the community that surrounds it. For the Sheehans, involvement in the dairy community is both a responsibility and a privilege. "We feel it is important to be involved with the dairy community, sharing our strengths and learning new strategies from fellow dairy producers," they explain. That philosophy has guided their family through decades of active



participation. Growing up in 4-H and Holstein programs, Bob and Jeannette wanted their children to have those same opportunities. Over the years, they served as dairy leaders, chaperones, and judging coaches, while also giving their time on local, state, and national boards. Today, Bob serves as president of the Minnesota Livestock Breeders Association, while Jeannette contributes her leadership on the World Dairy Expo Board and the Olmsted County Fair Board. The Sheehans also cherish the friendships and memories built through dairy. Like many farm families, their summer vacations were often spent at National Holstein Conventions, where they formed lifelong bonds. One of the closest connections has been with the Loren Olson family, whose children grew up alongside their own, creating friendships that still endure. For the Sheehans, being part of the dairy community means more than farming; it means belonging to a network of people who share the same passion, values, and commitment to agriculture. It is about giving back, building relationships, and carrying forward a way of life that has shaped their family for generations.

The Sheehan family has always placed a strong emphasis on breeding cows for both milk production and functional type. Much of their success can be credited to the genetic foundation they carefully built, working with influential sires such as Walkway Chief Mark, Blackstar, Picston Shottle, and Regancrest Durham. Bob's early experience as a sire analyst, combined with their son Andrew's career at ABS, gave the family valuable opportunities to study top cow families and select genetic lines that aligned with their goals. Over the years, this commitment to genetics has brought many rewarding moments, but none more memorable than 2016, when the Sheehans achieved a lifelong dream by exhibiting the Grand Champion Holstein

at Sheeknoll Farms has been an important part of the family's outreach for more than 12 years. It began when Bob and Jeannette's nephew from Chicago and later Jeannette's sister Libby's sons from Apple Valley, MN, wanted to be involved in showing dairy cattle. The first calf was leased to Dylan when he was only three years old. With the support of Jeannette's parents, Dylan was able to show a novice calf at the District Show in Cannon Falls. That calf, Sheeknoll Durham Arrow affectionately known as "Thomas the cow" was housed at her parents' farm in a hutch next to the garage, where her retired father found great joy in caring for it each day. As Dylan and his brother Cooper grew, friends also wanted to participate, leading to the formation of an urban 4-H club in their neighborhood. From there, the program quickly expanded. Today, Sheeknoll animals are leased to youth across multiple counties. In 2025, a total of 33 youth including 24 from Dakota County, 7 grandchildren, and 2 additional family members from Chicago leased calves from the Sheehan family. At the Dakota County Fair alone, 22 Sheeknoll animals were exhibited, with 13 spring calves in one class, 10 of them from Sheeknoll Farms. The experience not only resulted in smiles, pride, and five state fair trips, but also provided valuable mentorship, as older members taught younger ones how to care for, clip, and prepare their animals. With dairy farms becoming fewer in number across the state, the Sheehans are proud that their lease program is helping to sustain and grow the 4-H dairy project, ensuring young people still have the chance to be involved. Families who participate deeply value the opportunity, with many driving more than an hour twice a week throughout the summer so their children can work with their animals.

For the Sheehans, the lease program is about much more than showing cattle; it is about cultivating respect for agriculture. "Watching kids have an opportunity to experience where their food comes from is what drives our passion for this program," the family explains. "It gives them an appreciation for the care and work that goes into producing food, and helps them understand how important agriculture is in their lives." Many of these youth may go on to become legislators, health professionals, or even farmers, and the Sheehans believe the experience gives them perspective they will carry into any career path. Perhaps most rewarding is seeing how this opportunity has already influenced career choices for some participants. For the Sheehans, that impact and the joy of watching children form bonds with animals makes the lease program one of the most meaningful parts of their farm story.

Jeannette explained that seeing her family grow and now watching her grandchildren have a sound understanding of the importance of Faith, Family and Farming, is what makes her the most proud to be a dairy farm family!

GOLDEN GOPHER FUTURITY LI

- TWO-YEAR OLD FUTURITY -

The Golden Gopher Futurity is sponsored and governed by the Minnesota Holstein Association. Its purpose is to stimulate interest in breeding and developing outstanding Holsteins for type regardless of individual herd size. It is open to any Minnesota breeder of Holsteins identified through Holstein Association USA, Inc.

This will be a continuing program with the 2025 competition designated as Futurity No. LI. One nomination is required for each animal that competes. All nominations are the responsibility of the owner and must be made on regulation entry blanks, along with specified fees, postmarked by the nomination date and other rules. All money received from the nominations in the Futurity class shall make up the purse entered on the basis of their placings.

Any registered Holstein female, owned by a Minnesota Holstein Association member, and born from 9/01/24 through 8/31/25 is eligible for Golden Gopher Futurity L. One payment of \$25 shall be paid by 12/1/25.

A breeder may nominate any number of females in the type futurity. Nominations must be postmarked no later than the due date.

TYPE FUTURITY

Animals nominated will be shown in a special two-year old futurity class at the Minnesota State Show, in 2027, winners and awards to be based on the placing at that show. Showing in this class does not eliminate her from showing in the All-Minnesota two-year old classes. All rules and regulations of the show are to be adhered to. Placings will be made by an official show judge. The purse shall consist of all money received by nomination fees, less the expenses for its promotion and management. All money will be kept in a special fund and used only for futurity purposes. Money received for LI nominations will only be used for animals entered in that class. The money in this class will be divided among placings as follow:

First Place - 15%; 2nd Place - 10%; 3rd Place - 8%; 4th Place - 6%; 5th Place - 5%; 6-10 Placings - 4%; 11-15 Placings - 3%; 16-25 Placings - 2%. Remaining 1% to be used for administration fees.

If fewer than 25 animals are competing, the remainder will be divided equally among the entries.

All nomination fees are committed to the purse. No refunds will be made whether an animal completes or eligibility is discontinued.

Any animal sold after being nominated will remain eligible if the new owner is a Minnesota Holstein member.

The Minnesota Holstein Association is sponsoring and governing the futurity and will not be responsible for any accident or injury in connection with the show.

- Look at your animals that were born between September 1, 2024 and August 31, 2025.
- Choose any animal that you believe has the potential of doing well in their class.
- **Submit the form below along with payment prior to December 1, 2025.**

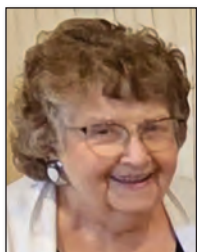

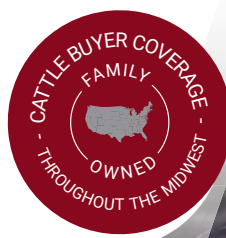
