THE SWANSON FAMILY - WRITTEN BY: KALIE RITTER

Three Sisters Dairy is owned and operated by Sierra, McKenzie, and Shelby Swanson. These girls are the fifth generation of dairy farmers in their family. Their farm is just west of Hutchsinson, Minn. The girls grew up on KurthHaven Farms, originally owned by their grandparents, Leroy and Sue Kurth. It is now owned by their unle and aunt, Mike and Kacie Kurth. Grandpa Leroy plays an extremely important role in the girl's passion for dairy farming. All three girls followed him around the farm since they were old enough to walk and he continues to mentor and work with them daily. He always provides a listening ear and an understanding heart. He is by far one of their greatest influences and mentors.

The Three Sisters herd is housed at KurthHaven Farms. All three Swanson girls developed a love of dairy cows by working with their grandparents, uncle, cousins, and mom, Kari, on the farm. Sierra handles day-to-day care of the herd, McKenzie works full-time off the farm, and Shelby is a freshman at the University of Minnesota. The family is active in their county, state, and national Holstein associations. Shelby and Kari currently serve on the state boards, MJHA and MHA, respectively, and Sierra is the treasurer of the McLeod county board. Shelby attended this year's National Holstein Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah. She received 5th place in the speech competition, and her speech was called "Sharing YOUR Story." On the farm, the sisters enjoy helping feed cows, milking, and caring for the show animals. It is a team effort and everyone has a specific, important role they play. The operation was founded in 2016 when Kurth-Haven transitioned to the next generation, and the girls wanted their own prefex to develop their growing herd. The sisters started by purchasing deep-pedigreed animals from cow families they admired; most of the herd traces back to 2 or 3 original cows. Sierra, McKenzie,

and Shelby have all worked with their own cow families. Liddleholme Emelia was a purchase Sierra made during the 2016 National Holstein Convention in New York. She had a daughter sired by Maverick Crush, who became a brood cow for Three Sisters. Emelia's daughters, both heifers and cows, have been perennial members of the show string. McKenzie has a love for red & whites, and developed a cow, KurthHaven Ella Reality-Red EX-91, that was bred by grandpa Leroy. Ella and her daughters were McKenzie's show animals toward the end of her 4-H career.

Circle-Drive Sid Josie was purchased by Shelby in 2019 after she leased Josie as a winter calf from longtime family friend Tim Albrecht. Josie went on to be an excellent cow. Her daughter, ThreeSisters Dback Jump4Joy is Shelby's first bred & owned excellent cows, and Jump-4Joy's daughter, ThreeSisters Jubilee Sidekcik, was Shelby's first animal she showed at the World Dairy Expo. ThreeSisters Jealous SL-Red, also a daughter, received 2024 All-MN Winter Calf, Reserve Junior Champion, Jr. All-MN Winter Calf, and Junior Champion of the Jr. Show. Liddleholme Diamond Lust EX-93, owned by Sierra and her partner, Rachel Kurth, was named senior and grand champion of the 2022 Midwest Fall National. This was a huge accomplishment for Sierra, Rachel, and the entire family because every member contributed to that win. The girls are focused on breeding for high-scoring and high-production cows. Currently, they primarily use Blondin bulls. All three of the Swanson girls were active in 4-H and FFA. This year, Shelby is a McLeod County Dairy Princess. Show season is busy for these ladies as they enjoy showing their cattle at regional shows, county fairs, state fairs, and the World Dairy Expo. Shows are a time for their family and friends to come together.

- In an effort to recognize cows that have not competed in the show ring, no animals that have shown on the state or national level in milking form within the past 2 years can be entered. This includes MN district shows, MN State Show, Midwest Fall National, and World Dairy Expo. Animals previously shown as heifers but not as a lactating cows may be entered.
 - Limit of three photos per entry (side profile and rear udder shots are preferred).
 - Limit of 3 entries per class.
- Animals need to be bred and owned by a paid MHA member and animal must reside in either Minnesota or South Dakota.

Milkhouse Flowers is a family-owned and operated flower farm owned by Tim and Dawn Schauer. "We are a fifth-generation family farm, and Milkhouse Flowers is only a portion of our overall operation as Schauer Farms Inc. We also raise commodity crops and custom-raise dairy heifers and crossbred beefers". In 2017 the family farm transitioned, this allowed Dawn to pursue a different daily path. Dawn decided to go back to school to study floral design. While taking these classes, Dawn discovered that she could grow her own specialty flowers to design with. From there, Milkhouse Flowers was born and grew its first flowers for production in 2019.

"Flower farming is no different from farming in general. We hand seed, hand plant and hand harvest all of our flowers, therefore it's a labor of love! Our flower preparation and design work is done out of the original milkhouse, which was reconfigured into a work room. Therefore, this is where my business name came from. I work just as much in the milkhouse today as I did when we were milking cows. In 2021 we added our first unheated hoop house and since then have added two additional hoop houses. This past winter we transformed a portion of our dairy barn, which was an addition to our original dairy barn, into a heated greenhouse space by replacing the roof with greenhouse panels and minor indoor renovations. This heated space is where we now start and grow our seedlings in the spring and host our holiday workshops in the fall/ winter. We currently grow over 100 different varieties of cut flowers on 2 acres, made up of a mix of annuals, perennials, bulbs and woodies. Our flowers are sold to the community through our flower bouquet sub-

scription, daily vase arrangements, and special events. We only design and work with the flowers we grow so this concept makes our arrangements very unique. We also sell our flowers to the wholesale market, including local flower shops, event designers and the Twin Cities Flower Exchange in Minneapolis. We offer farm tours, flower bars, DIY flower packages, and flower arranging workshops. During the holiday season, we fill our barn with winter greens and outdoor decorating accessories while also hosting winter porch pots and wreath workshops in our heated greenhouse portion of the barn."

The family is continuing to explore growing a variety of things on the farm in addition to flowers. Years ago they planted both Fronteca and Concord grape plants. These were planted with the sole intention of growing to shade their chicken coop, but little did they know that these grape bushes would be great fruit producers! Over the last couple of years, they have harvested the grapes off of these bushes and worked with an outsourced individual to make their own grape wine. They have since added apples and raspberries to the farm which are now added into their growing wine production. "We look forward to pairing our Milkhouse Flower workshops with a glass of Schauer Farms Wine!"

Schauer Farms still has cattle on the farm as they raise about 400 dairy heifer replacements and crossbred beef cattle. The family still continues to own a number of registered holsteins as well. This group of holsteins contains both milking cows and heifers that were once a part of their sons 4H projects. The family also stays active in the Minnesota Holstein Association as Tim serves on the Sibley County Holstein Board.

Breeder's Seminar: February 3-6, 2025

with guest presenter Dr. Jeffrey Bewley

Dr. Jeffrey Bewley is from Rineyville, Kentucky where he grew up working on his grandfather's dairy farm. He received a B.S. in Animal Sciences from the University of Kentucky in 1998. In 2000, he completed his M.S. in Dairy Science at the University of Wisconsin-Madison under the direction of Dr. Roger Palmer with a focus on dairy modernization. His PhD work under Dr. Mike Schutz at Purdue University focused on the application and economics of Precision Dairy Farming technologies. For 9.5 years, Jeffrey was on the faculty at the University of Kentucky as an Extension Dairy Specialist. He has also worked with IceRobotics, PerforMix Nutrition, BoviSync, and Alltech. Dr. Bewley is currently Dairy Analytics and Innovation Scientist with Holstein Association USA.

Jeffrey's professional interests include Precision Dairy Monitoring Technologies, Dairy Records Management and Analytics, Dairy Cattle Genetics and Genomics, Economic Decision Support, Animal Health Economics, Compost Bedded Pack Barn Management and Construction, Freestall Barn Management and Construction, Mastitis Management and Prevention, and Dairy Farm Financial Analysis. Jeffrey Bewley received the American Dairy Science Association Foundation Scholar Award in Production and American Dairy Science Association Cargill Animal Nutrition Young Scientist Awards in 2015. He was named to the Vance Publishing 40 Under 40 for Agriculture Award in 2014. He has published and presented extensively around the world. He is an active member of the International Committee for Animal Recording, the National Mastitis Council, and the American Dairy Science Association. Dr. Bewley is also a certified CowSignals trainer, a MEX udder health coach, and a Lean Farming trainer. Jeffrey pursues his passion for dairy cattle genetics as a partner in IceBlue Genetics and Fit Genetics. He serves on the advisory boards of multiple dairy technology companies.


