

### MINNESOTA & SOUTH DAKOTA HERDS

MAKE HIGH-RANKING HOLSTEIN BREED AVERAGE (BAA%) LISTS

Earlier this year, Holstein Association USA released the lists of the top Holstein Breed Age Average (BAA%) herds for 2023 classifications. A number of herds from Minnesota and South Dakota ranked in the list of Overall Top 200 BAA Herds for 2024.

The top herd from Region 6 was Ryan Griffin of Minnesota. Griffin recorded a BAA of 113.3 with ten cows. Several herds from Minnesota and South Dakota made the top 200 list and respective lists for herd size. Minnesota Holstein Association would like to congratulate all of these herds for this achievement.

The Holstein Breed Average (BAA%) value provides a way to compare the score of an animal (and herd average) to the average of the breed, taking into account the age of the animal and stage of lactation. All animals receive an individual BAA value on your herd classification report, and herds participating in the Classic or Standard options of the Holstein Classification program receive an overall BAA for the herd.

#### IMPORTANT RULES TO REVIEW

(A full list of rules can be found online at www.mnholstein.com)

- 1. State show entry fee is \$20. Entries can be completed on FairEntry.com.
- 2. There will be no reserved stall fee and cattle will be stalled upon arrival.
- 3. State show entries must be received by May 27, 2025. Entries received after the May 27, 2025 deadline will be assessed a \$50 per animal fee. Entries received after June 13, 2025 will be \$100. Substitutions will be permitted.
- 4. All identification papers must be presented and identified in the exhibitor's name, except papers presented with a signed transfer and fees attached. Transfers and fees will be collected and sent to the Holstein Association USA. No calls will be made to verify ownership. Animals that are going on to other shows will be verified with Holstein Association USA. If these transfers are not recorded by state show check-in, the exhibitor(s) will be ineligible to show at a Minnesota Holstein sponsored district or state show for the following calendar year. animals need to be transferred before checkin
- 5. Copies of identification certificates will not be accepted. Original and association duplicates of identification certificates are permitted and accepted. Email copies of both sides of the identification papers from the Holstein Association USA will be accepted for show. It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide the email. 87%RHA is eligible to show.
- 6. Syndicate or partnership animals may be shown at the Minnesota district and state shows providing the following requirements are met: 1. Show proof of ownership with a list of all members from Holstein Association USA, if all members are not individually listed on identification certificate. 2. Entry fee paid by exhibitor. 3. Paid state membership by each partner. 7. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit, and everyone is using the same prefix, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder.
- 8. As exhibitor of all dairy animals originating from my farm to be exhibited at the Minnesota State Holstein Show agree that said animals have been vaccinated with either a killed or modified-live vaccine for the following diseases: IBR, BVD and Lepto within six months of the show date. If any outbreak should occur and is linked to our originating farm, Minnesota Holstein Association will not be liable.
- 9. The best udder in each milking class will be recognized with a rosette ribbon at the state show.
- 10. Exhibitors who wish to be recognized for production must identify accordingly in FairEntry.com and provide a DHIA herd code and barn ID. From there the records will be officially verified by DHIA. Any records sent in after the entry deadline will not be eligible for receiving production recognition.
- 11. There are no dry cow classes.
- 12. Premier Breeders (Bred and Owned) the owner of the dam at the time of service shall be considered the breeder of the animal. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder. Please Note: For non-family partnerships, to qualify for Bred & Owned Awards, one of the original owners must be listed as one of the current owners.
- 13. Exhibitors at any MN Holstein district or state show must live in Minnesota or South Dakota
- 14. Any animal exhibited at any MN Holstein district or state show must be shown in only one state.
- 15. Premier exhibitor and premier breeder points will be based on six animals. Exhibitor must be the owner. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit, and everyone is using the same prefix, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder. However, where the ownership is from two or more herds they will be considered as separate entries as stated owners on the paper with one owner having to be a resident of the state of Minnesota and a member of Minnesota Holstein Association. Senior points, starting at 20 with a 2-point drop between each placing down to 10th place, will be awarded for milking cow classes. Junior points will be awarded to the junior animals and will start at 10 points with a 1- point drop between each place down to 10th place.

#### JUNIOR RULES AND REGULATIONS

The show will begin at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, June 20, 2025.

All entries must be in place and checked in 24 hours prior to the show.

1. Exhibitors must be a minimum of nine years old to participate, but not have reached their 21st birthday by January 1 in the year competing. Members who become 21 years of age during the current year will be allowed to compete in Junior activities until December 31st of the current year and not beyond that time.

- 2. All junior members will show under Minnesota Junior Holstein Association rules and animals must be shown by the owner except in extreme situations and then approved by the junior show committee a week prior to the show. Alternate leadsman forms can be requested if needed.
- 3. Any animal shown at the Minnesota State Junior Holstein Show with the exhibitor's name listed by May 27, 2025 qualify to be shown. If you wish to show an animal with the immediate family's prefix the registration paper does not need the exhibitors name on it (immediate family means parents and children). Adult/Junior partnerships are permitted. \*This rule only applies for the MN Jr. State Show.
- 4. **4-H Lease Acceptance** the Minnesota Junior Holstein Association will be accepting 4-H leases for the MJHA State Show. To enter a leased animal, you need to submit a copy of the registration paper and a copy of your lease affidavit on FairEntry. com.
- 5. State show entries must be received by May 27, 2025. Substitutions will be permitted. All entries must be completed on FairEntry.com.
- 6. The MN Junior State Show will start at 8:00 a.m. on June 20. The first class will be Class 22-J (Novice Calf), then Class 10-J through 18-J, then Class 1-J through 7-J ending with Class 23-J through 25-J.
- 7. Novice Class: Novice Calves may be from class 1-J, 2-J and 3-J. The calf may be shown in another class but the novice show person may not show in another class. Please remember to keep the size of the calf appropriate for the youth's ability. Ownership rules do not apply to novice class show person. The animals will NOT be placed and all youth will receive the same award.
- 8. All junior exhibitors are subject to the PDCA Code of Conduct Rules.

#### **ENTRY FEE**

Entry fee for the Minnesota Junior Holstein Show is \$10 per head. If you would like to participate in both the open and junior show, both fees need to paid, and you need to register your animal as such in Fairentry.com. The fee is per head therefore you do not need to pay \$10 for a novice calf if the calf is already being exhibited in a different class. Only one animal per class will be cataloged. Substitutes can be made at the show. A \$20 late fee will be assessed for those entries that come in after May 27, 2025.

#### JUNIOR BRED AND OWNED

Junior Bred and Owned Class is based off the National Rules. To be eligible for Junior Bred & Owned, at least one of the Junior owners must be listed as a breeder and owner on the registration certificate.

#### **TRANSFERS**

A reminder to all juniors to get your junior state show animals transferred or registered now. Animals shown in the Minnesota State Junior Holstein Show must be transferred into the exhibitor's name by May 27, 2025.

- If papers are late coming, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to call Holstein Association USA so they have the papers in hand on the day of the show.
- There will be absolutely no transfer or registration applications accepted for junior show animals and there will be no phone calls or other such inquiries made to Holstein Association USA on junior animals.

#### **ACCEPTABLE IDENTIFICATION**

All animals exhibted in the Minnesota State Junior Holstein Show must have a verified form of identification at check-in. This could include: Holstein USA tags, registered RFID tag, drawing, or photo on registration paper.

# 2024 Wisconsin Outstanding Holstein Girl & Boy Features

The winners of these awards are chosen based on their Distinguished Junior Member applications and an interview. Our 2024 recipients were recognized at the Wisconsin Junior Holstein Convention at the end of December 2024. Get to meet the winners, Evan Hathaway and Ainsley Noble.

#### **Evan Hathaway**



Wisconsin Junior Holstein Association (WHJA) builds the future of the dairy industry not just in Wisconsin, but across the United States. Through competitive rounds of quiz bowl and jeopardy, creativity with photography and crafts, and working hard on award forms, lessons are learned and relationships are built. WJHA is home for juniors to prosper and grow into the future

leaders of the dairy industry. But amongst everything else, WJHA is home to hopes, dreams, and proud accomplishments many youth believe to be impossible to reach. As for me, the accomplishment that I only ever dreamed of came true during this year's Wisconsin Junior Holstein Convention when I was named the 2024 Wisconsin Outstanding Holstein Boy.

My name is Evan Hathaway and I am the 19-year-old son of Alycia and the late Josh Hathaway. I grew up in Barneveld, Wis. with my parents and two siblings, Elliot and Emma. Currently, I am attending the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities, where I am majoring in both animal science and agricultural communication and marketing. Outside of class, I am very involved in the Gopher Dairy Club, the Minnesota Dairy Judging Team, UMN CFANS Undergraduate Student Board, Delta Theta Sigma Fraternity, and the Iowa County Junior Holstein Association.

The start of my Holstein story may not look quite like many of my peers', but it's certainly one that has taught me numerous lessons. When I was younger, I never wanted to listen and appreciate the stories that my family told about our homebred Holsteins and their success in the barn and various shows, let alone even step foot on the farm. One night, I was forced to go to the farm as a punishment and was tasked with helping feed the calves. I enjoyed the forced opportunity to work with the calves that night, and my experience ignited the initial flame

in me that drove me to keep coming back to help with chores around the farm.

After the dispersal of our herd in 2019, I realized that breeding and developing show cattle was a hobby I wanted to turn into a way of life, and even a potential career. I searched sales and breeders' barns to find heifers I was confident in to lay the foundation of my breeding program.

The most notable animal I purchased was Schluter Atlanta-Red-ET EX-92, an Altitude granddaughter of brood cow, Hilrose Advent Anna-Red. Atlanta was a heifer that taught me many lessons about hard work, perseverance, and optimism. Atlanta is now owned with Matthew and Elizabeth Gunst, and Smith-Crest. After the creation of the Atlanta partnership, I moved my show cattle to Smith-Crest and Ladinodale, where I now call home and continue my passion for breeding and exhibiting cattle by assisting with show prep and daily chores outside of college.

Purchasing Atlanta allowed me to exhibit at numerous shows, including the District 3 Holstein Show, Wisconsin Summer Championship Show, Wisconsin Junior State Fair, Midwest Youth Dairy Classic, and many more. Not only has obtaining Atlanta allow me to get started with showing Registered Holsteins at a higher level, but it has also given me my first experience marketing embryos domestically and internationally, as well as beginning my own breeding decisions.

Along with pursuing my dreams of raising and showing animals, I also became involved in the Wisconsin Holstein Association. In 2021, I attended the WJHA Area Activity Days, where I participated in dairy quiz bowl for the first time thanks to my mentor, Angela Davis Brown. The following year in 2022, I attended my first Junior Convention in Appleton, Wis. As a county, we competed in dairy jeopardy and dairy quiz bowl. The highlight of that first convention was receiving the honor of being elected as a first-year JAC. As a JAC, I represented the southwest district. I had many responsibilities, including being the chairperson for the Wisconsin Summer Championship Show showmanship competition, selecting judges and running the showmanship competitions for my district, serving as the chair for the activity room at junior convention, and being a member of the social media team for the Wisconsin Junior Holstein media accounts.

Becoming involved in the dairy industry and the Wisconsin Holstein Association has been one of the most rewarding decisions I have ever made. My involvement has taught me that I can do things I could not have ever imagined wanting to do and so much more. This association has allowed me to grow personally and professionally, and is continuing to help me to reach my future goals.

I owe so much to the Wisconsin Holstein Association and the people that make up this organization. Ask questions, do not be afraid of failure, build relationships, and always say, "Yes!," to new opportunities. Where you came from and who you know is not what defines you and your success. YOU create opportunities for yourself, YOU work hard, and most importantly, YOU write your own story both inside and out of this industry we all call home.

### **Ainsley Noble**



The saying has always gone that "the best things take time."

One of the best experiences of my life has been competing at the Wisconsin Junior Holstein Convention since I was eight years old. And the one dream I've had since I first watched the older youth achieve milestones, was to be named the Outstanding Holstein Girl. In my final year competing at the very

convention that raised me, my greatest achievement yet came to fruition. Being named the Outstanding Holstein Girl alongside my parents, county members, mentors, and other juniors is an indescribable feeling.

My name is Ainsley Noble and I am the 20-year-old daughter of Troy and Jaime Noble. Along with my two siblings, Drew and Macie, we are the sixth generation to call Nobland Farms home. There, we focus on cows with productive life, while also breeding for exceptional feet and legs, udders, and milk production. When I cannot be found in the show heifer barn at home, or exhibiting cattle, I am four hours away pursuing a college degree. I am currently a junior at the University of Wisconsin-River Falls, majoring in agricultural education with a dairy science minor. Upon completion of my schooling, I intend to teach high school agriculture and advise FFA. I also plan to return home to my family's operation to continue working closely with the calves and youngstock.

I feel beyond grateful to be in the position I am, following in the footsteps of those who paved the path before me. The most special part of being awarded the 2024 Outstanding Holstein Girl is that I come behind my father, Troy, who was named the Outstanding Holstein Boy in 1997. Twenty-seven years later and

the story and commitment has never faltered.

My grandparents began laying the foundation

for youth in Grant County involved in the Junior Holstein Association, in which my parents followed. The youth of Grant County are who forever shaped me, growing up sleeping beside each other in pole sheds at the county fair, fighting over who buzzed first in quiz bowl practice, and who I fought with as if they were my own siblings. I began attending quiz bowl practices at a young age, and that's where my Junior Holstein story began taking off. Years down the road, I began being dragged to dairy judging practice. And from that moment on, I was hooked. Although I can confidently say I enjoyed giving reasons more when you got to be in a group on the junior team at the state contest, I have learned so much along the way. In 2023, I placed second high individual at the Wisconsin State 4-H Contest, where my team also placed second. That earned us a position to judge at the All-American in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. I am beyond honored to be the 2024 Outstanding Holstein Girl and will never be able to repay those who helped me achieve this milestone. # 2024 ILLINOIS JUNIOR BREEDER LORILEE SCHULTZ

Lorilee Schultz is proud to raise her three-year-old daughter, Lucy Fahr, at Mil-R-Mor Farm in Orangeville, IL, where she has managed the herd of 120 Registered Holsteins with 60 milking cows since 2008.

Lorilee's breeding goals continue the legacy of her grandparents, Bob and Kaye Miller, as she works to develop strong cow families with high type and longevity.

She bred over 50 cows that scored Excellent and developed more than half a dozen cows with lifetime production of over 200,000 pounds of milk. The Mil-R-Mor herd received the Holstein Association USA Progressive Breeder Registry Award in 2021.

The past five years, Mil-R-Mor received the Prairie Farms Premier Producer Award for milk quality and was among the top ten for lowest Somatic cell average in 2023. In the showring, Mil-R-Mor was the Premier Breeder at the NW Illinois District Holstein Show four times.

The Mil-R-Mor herd is still heavily influenced by Glenridge Citation Roxy and many high-quality Roxy sale consignments have recently found their way to success in other herds. There are also currently several ten, eleven, and twelve-generation Excellent Roxy descendants in the herd.

While not a Roxy, Mil-R-Mor Jeeves Ribbon was one of Lorilee's favorite cows over the years. Descended from one of her original 4-H heifers, Ribbon calved 11 times in 11 years, 3 months, and classified Very Good. Ribbon's granddaughter, Mil-R-Mor Crush Rimona, is one of the herd highlights today at Excellent 91.

In addition to herself, Lorilee operates the dairy with one full-time employee, Jenny Weier, her Aunt Kathy Miller, and part-time employees. Lorilee's brothers, Charlie and Dave Schultz, harvest the forages. Together, the family and employees enjoy being an integral part of the local community and economy. It was an honor for Lorilee and her daughter, Lucy, to be carved into butter at the 2023 Illinois State Fair to represent the state's 96 percent of farms which are family operated.

Lorilee is currently coaching the Orangeville FFA Chapter dairy judging team. Mil-R-Mor farm annually hosts 4-H and collegiate judging teams for pre-World Dairy Expo judging practices.

This busy young woman contributes to dairy organizations important to her including serving as Chair of National Holstein Foundation Board of Trustees, Chair of National Milk Producer Federation Young Cooperators Council, and board of director

member of Dairy Girl Network.

Through the Midwest Dairy Association, Lorilee has advocated at events held in partnership with the Chicago Bears, served as a host farm for the Adopt-A-Cow program, and recently spoke about her sustainability practices to a group of key influencers.

Lorilee is passionate about working with organizations to gain more representation for women in industry-wide groups such as cooperative boards, breed organizations, and lobbying groups. She was invited to speak on this topic at the 2023 World Dairy Summit.

Lorilee and Lucy are thankful for all the family support and love having cousins in the barn and in the showring.

### 2024 ILLINOIS SENIOR BREEDER **STEVE IRWIN**

This year's Senior Breeder Award winner is Steve Irwin. Steve has been a life-long supporter of the Illinois Holstein Association and the dairy industry. He is a very familiar face around the organization,



as he has served as state vice-president in 2018 and 2019, then filled the role of president in 2020 and 2021. Steve has also chaired the State Show, membership and publication committees for the Illinois Holstein Association, as well as serving as a director and executive committee member. However, his contribution to the dairy industry started many years ago.

Steve grew up on the family farm in Beason, where, from a very young age, he learned the value of hard work and the responsibility of caring for livestock. He became the fourth generation to carry on the dairy farm and has since dedicated his life to developing our 60-head dairy herd throughout the years.

Breeding great Holsteins has been a life-long goal of his and one that has yielded great success. Steve certainly achieved that goal with Irwindale Leduc Macy! When she was sold as a two-year old, Steve received much recognition as her breeder. Macy was a two-time class winner at the Royal and her owners from Rocky Mountain Holsteins give much praise to Steve for breeding such an exceptional cow.

Irwindale's success with breeding outstanding Holsteins goes much further than their legacy with Macy. After winning the 2-year-old futurity and topping the Illinois Golden Opportunity Sale, Irwindale Leduc Molly created her own legacy at Team Holsteins. For a herd of its size, Irwindale Holsteins has made a significant footprint in the Holstein breed.

Breeding excellent cattle goes hand-in-hand with showing the animals you have developed along the way. Just as Steve did throughout his childhood, Steve's children enjoyed their time in the show ring at county fairs, state Holstein shows, and the state fair. Because of what their dad instilled in them as a Holstein breeder, his children knew the value of receiving that Bred and Owned award in class, no matter where you stood in line. There is a sense of pride in knowing that an animal's pedigree runs deep in the history of your dairy herd, which is sometimes worth more



than a blue ribbon.

In Fall 2023, the difficult decision was made to quit milking. Steve took his time finding new homes for our cattle, putting some in sales and selling others to respected breed-

ers around the Midwest. On August 31, 2024, the last cow was milked on the farm after 100+ years. 100 years of pulling calves in negative temperatures, baling hay on the hottest day of the year, way too many 12+ hour days to count, and all the highs, lows, and unpredictability this industry throws at you, and yet it is still so hard to say goodbye to a way of life and a family heritage that took generations to build.

It's safe to say this next chapter of Steve's life is going to look a little different, however it isn't going to stop him from continuing to attend functions related to the Holstein cow. As a matter of fact, he will have more time to attend sales, shows, conventions and serve on committees. Take this as your first warning, he's not going away anytime soon!

# HOLSTEIN USA LOCAL LENS TOUR

### AT NATIONAL HOLSTEIN CONVENTION

This year, Holstein enthusiasts are invited to gather in Saint Louis for the 2025 National Holstein Convention June 23-26, 2025. The convention will kick off with the Local Lens Farm Tour on Monday, June 23. Attendees will visit three farms in Illinois that have found their niche in the dairy industry through innovation – Wilra Farms, Rolling Lawns Farm and Carter's Corner.

#### WILRA FARMS, NASHVILLE, IL

The farm is owned and operated by the fourth and fifth generation of the Harre family including Doug and his brother Curt, along with Doug's sons Clint and Nick and Doug's nephews Matt and Lucas. Everyone has their specialty they focus on within the operation.

Doug and Curt's parents, Wilmer and Vera, were married in 1956. That year, they purchased their first two Registered Holsteins and the couple combined their first names to create the Wilra prefix. One of the two cows purchased was from the same maternal line as Wilra Ramos 598-ET. "Everything we do today is because of Ramos 598," says Doug. Every animal on the farm today traces back to her, he says.

When the first animals were genomic tested, it was clear that it would uncover cows that had previously been passed over – Wilra Ramos 598-ET was one of those cows. "Her story is an interesting one," Doug explains. As a two-year-old, she got off to a hard start because she had freshened in summer heat with twins. While the Harre family was contemplating selling her, they received her genomic test results. "She came back much higher than her parent average," says Doug. "We started flushing her, and everything she made always came back higher than parent average." She went on to thrive in her subsequent lactations, making 280,000 pounds of lifetime milk production and classifying Excellent.

Embracing genomics early-on has been key in the family's success to making and marketing high-genomic individuals. On average, the Harre family sends fifteen bulls into A.I. annually. "We have a working relationship with Select Sires. Some of highest genetic animals are at Genetic Futures to be flushed," says Doug.

On the farm, the Harre family utilizes embryo transfer with the top eight percent of females in their herd. They rank females by adding their Net Merit Dollar (NM\$) genomic value plus their Total Performance Index (TPI) genomic value and sort them from highest to lowest. The ranking is carried through the remainder of their breeding program where only breeding-age heifers with the highest values are bred using sexed semen for the first two services. The bottom forty percent of heifers are sold as weaned calves. "Currently, our two-month-old calves need a combined value of TPI and NM\$ of 4250 to remain in the herd, and a combined value of TPI and NM\$ above 4500 will be flushed," explains Doug.

Approximately half of the 620-cow milking herd will carry an embryo, and the other half will be bred to a SimAngus or Angus sire – with the exception of a few high-end young cows that carry their own calf.

When it comes to sire selection, Harre looks at NM\$ and TPI. "In the last two years, we've also put additional emphasis on functional type and health and fitness traits," says Doug. Avoiding extreme inbreeding is also a consideration.

All calves born are identified using Holstein USA's Basic ID program, and calves that are flushed are registered to enter them into the herdbook. The farm also utilizes Holstein USA tags for iden-

tification, and Sire Evaluations for Type (SETs) are conducted at the farm.

"For me, I like numbers and statistics," says Doug. He enjoys working with the family to set goals and track progress. "It's what drives me," he says. He's amazed at the progress the herd has made as he both reviews the numbers and observes the herd. The herd boasts a combined fat and protein of 8.05 and 121 pounds of energy corrected milk. "I'm excited for the future as we continue to see progress in our two-year-olds and even our heifers," says Doug.

#### **ROLLING LAWNS FARM, GREENVILLE, IL**

"Registered Holsteins gave me the confidence to do this," says Michael Turley, a fourth-generation farmer at Rolling Lawns Farm. The farm was established in 1910, and Michael's great-grandfather, Samuel Schmollinger, became a member of the Holstein Association in 1920 – beginning the farm's 115-year legacy with Registered Holsteins.

On May 30, 2018, the Turley family bottled their first milk. Michael says it felt natural to take the Rolling Lawns prefix, started by Michael's father in 1952, and utilize it for the consumer-facing brand. "We made a pivot from commodity to consumer marketing, and utilized the Registered Holstein cow to do it," Michael explains. "It's simple – the Registered Holstein cow is our greatest and most marketable asset to connect to consumers." The shift allowed Michael to maintain his farm size while creating additional value.

The family opened The Milk House in 2019, using it as a processing facility and retail location. The walls within The Milk House paint a picture of the rich history of Registered Holsteins at Rolling Lawns Farm. These cows that grace the store help visitors connect not only to the farm, but with the cows through their pedigrees. "We traced one of our long-standing families back to its origin," he explains. The pedigree begins in 1883 and spans 40-generations. It helps build a connection to the cows and helps consumers feel educated, according to Michael.

Today, Rolling Lawns Farm milks 85-head of Registered Holsteins and operates with five employees at the dairy farm and ten employees at the processing plant. All of the milk produced at Rolling Lawns Farm is processed into Rolling Lawns products. The product line includes six flavors of milk, half and half, heavy cream and ice cream – with the core products being whole milk for coffee shops and chocolate milk for grocery retail sales.

Rolling Lawns Farms processes milk five days a week – fluid milk on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and ice cream on Tuesday and Thursday. "Milk goes from cow to consumer in roughly six hours," Michael says. "Sometimes, it's faster than that."

While roughly twenty-five percent of sales occur at The Milk House, the rest come from wholesale accounts, including more than 150 coffee shops, grocery stores, restaurants and bakeries. Michael and his team travel 45 minutes East every day to St. Louis and its metropolitan population of 2.8 million urban consumers to service these accounts and deliver Rolling Lawns products. "There's nothing better than processing milk in the morning and arriving in St. Louis at noon with fresh product," he says. It doesn't get much more fresh or local, two things that are in-vogue and fulfil a gap in the high-end market.

Michael enjoys seeing how the accounts utilize, feature and talk about the offering – either in its use as an ingredient or as a consumable product. He'll see coffee shops create a specialty latte around a moment in time, a grocery store run a promotion, or a restaurant

highlight on their menu how they make butter – all endorsing and validating Rolling Lawns products as high-quality. "They become our spokespeople," he explains. "They are our connection to the urban consumers we otherwise can't get to."

"There's no simpler supply chain than milk, and no greater transparency in food than with dairy farming," he says. It all starts with quality care of the cows to produce a quality product."

#### **CARTER'S CORNER - GREENVILLE, IL**

Tyler Carter developed his passion for breeding and developing Registered Holsteins working alongside his family. "When I was growing up, my dad would take me to sales with him across the Midwest," Tyler recalls. That sparked his interest in acquiring, developing and marketing high-type genetics.

Tyler has had an exceptional, albeit young, career exhibiting Registered Holsteins at local, state and national levels. Opportunities to develop great individuals for the show ring can come from different avenues. "Sometimes it's finding that one cow out in the freestall barn, or a cow that comes from another show facility," he says. Either way, he enjoys evaluating the individual animal and tailoring a program to help her achieve her full potential. Tyler built a show barn with eight box stalls to cater to these individuals.

Beyond the show ring, Tyler enjoys developing cow families. "I enjoy creating matings that I believe could create the next great cow," Tyler says. "It's very challenging, but I enjoy the challenge."

Tyler began utilizing IVF to facilitate the development of the next generation. In 2024, he constructed a satellite IVF facility on the farm. He recently partnered with TransOva Genetics, and they schedule donors to be collected every two weeks at Carter's Corner. Not only does Tyler flush his own cattle, but it is also open to any dairy and beef farmers in the area. "On our next flush date, we're scheduled to have seventeen donors – with four of them from our farm," he explains. Haul-in donors pay a \$100 chute fee, and about \$200 per em-

bryo on average. Currently, the oocytes are sent to the TransOva lab in Atlanta and arrangements can be made to courier back fresh or frozen embryos.

Two notable cows with a heavy influence at Carter's Corner are Ms Atwood Lacey and Uber-Haven Defiant Chrome-Red – both scored EX-95 on May

18, 2021. Two favorites Tyler is currently working with are Retso Sidekick Charlene EX-92 MAX and a high-genomic Homecoming daughter of S-S-I Doc Have Not 8783-ET EX-92 DOM.

Over the years, the Carters have also had success with high Cow Type Production Index (CTPI) cows and genomics. The farm currently has two exciting outcross bulls in A.I. – Carters-Corner FC HiHope and Carters-Corner Dazzle. Both hail from BGP Delta Harmony, who recently calved again.

When selecting service sires, Tyler is focused on creating well-balanced cows with longevity, especially as the show ring shifts its preference to a more moderate-sized, strong cow. Tyler selects sires with high type and udder composite, good strength and solid health and fitness traits. Heifers will get bred using sexed semen for the first two services before moving to conventional. Cows will get bred to either sexed, conventional or beef depending on their genetic potential and service number.

While Tyler's passion for genetics and cow families has helped improve the farm's herd, he has also taken the opportunity to market genetics. Tyler and his dad, Andy, maintain their 100-cow herd size by marketing cattle annually. The Carters will market cattle through both public and private sales. "Our motto is to sell our best," he says.

Carter's Corner will be hosting a live sale with HammerTime Auctioneering on Tuesday, June 24 at the farm. The sale will begin at 6:00pm CST, and Cowbuyer will be on-hand. The sale will follow Carter's philosophy of selling their best as they offer a selection of cows, heifers and embryos.









### 2025 MINNESOTA DISTINGUISHED JUNIOR MEMBER

"Everything happens for a reason, but it's up to you to find the purpose in it." – Unknown. This quote has been a guiding mantra for me, a reminder that every moment, good or bad, carries a lesson. It's a belief that fuels my passion, perseverance, and commitment to growth at every step of my journey.

Hi, I'm Alexis Hoefs, a 19-year-old from New Prague, Minnesota, and the oldest daughter of Jimmy and Lisa Hoefs. I have three younger siblings-Caleigh, Maddie, and Quinton-and together we help out on our family farm, Hoefs Dairy. It's been in our family since 1861, and I'm proud to be the seventh generation growing up there. Currently, I'm a sophomore at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities, studying Animal Science with an emphasis in Dairy Production and minoring in Agricultural Communications and Marketing. I also own 20 registered Holsteins under the Montyedge prefix with my siblings. Our cows are housed at Hoefs Dairy, which milks 250 cows in a double-eight herringbone parlor and raises all their own replacements. We also finish out steers, rent out a pig barn, and manage 1,000 acres of cropland. One of our proudest achievements is maintaining an exceptionally low somatic cell count (SCC), recently reaching an all-time low of 27. This accomplishment reflects our commitment to superior cow care and diligent management practices. Key management practices include consistent pre- and post-dipping of cows, thoroughly cleaning and rebedding the freestalls during each milking, promptly detecting and treating mastitis, and administering antibiotics at dry-off to prevent infections. My dad, the herd manager, has played a pivotal role in this success, ensuring the highest care for our cows every day.

Since 2019, I have been extremely active on the farm as we released our part-time employees. There was a need for help and I was more than willing to fill in. Before college, I contributed to the farm by milking cows a few times a week during the school year and assisting on weekends. Summers were even busier, as I took on responsibilities like caring for show heifers, assisting with weekly herd checks,

administering vaccinations, and managing the calving pen. Since starting college, I still make time to help during breaks and weekends.

Running Montyedge Holsteins is a team effort between my dad and me, but I take the lead on the details. I oversee matings, order semen, register calves, organize classifications, formulate show feeds, and handle all show preparation—from ordering supplies to training the heifers. The best part of it all is working one-on-one with the heifers, building a bond as I train them to walk. There's nothing like the satisfaction of seeing a heifer walk perfectly beside you, knowing the connection you've built together.

My journey into the world of registered Holsteins began in 2016 when I attended my first World Dairy Expo with my grandparents and Uncle Tim. I was captivated by the world-class cattle and the passion of the exhibitors. I loved walking through the barns and hearing my grandpa talk with his buddies about the cows. At that moment, I wasn't super knowledgeable about judging cattle and what to look for. But a spark was ignited! I was hooked on showing and determined to one day reach the colored shavings. My grandpa and Uncle Tim must have noticed because they talked with my parents about purchasing my own registered Holsteins. They saw a little girl who was extremely passionate about cattle and would have given anything to compete on the big stages. "Everything Happens for a Reason", this moment started the most exciting chapter of my life, the chapter that forced me out of my comfort zone, introduced me to so many wonderful youth who share the same passions as me, and helped me grow so much as a person.

In 2019, I attended my first Minnesota All-Breeds Junior Convention, where I was introduced to quiz bowl, speeches, and a community of like-minded youth. I received "punishment" at the last meal and had to sizzle like bacon in front of everyone. It was funny or everyone else to watch and slightly embarrassing for me. Nevertheless, I was hooked and set on not missing another convention. My enthusiasm only grew, and in 2021, my quiz bowl team won the state

competition, earning my first trip to the National Holstein Convention in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. The experience was unforgettable, filled with new connections and lots of learning. The following year in 2022, our team won the senior division and another trip to nationals, this time in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Most recently in 2024, I decided to challenge myself by competing in the speech contest, even though public speaking isn't something I'm naturally comfortable with. I knew it was a skill I could develop, and I'm so glad I took the leap. I ended up placing 2nd, which earned me a trip to the National Contest in Salt Lake City, Utah. This experience pushed me outside my comfort zone and helped me grow in ways I'm truly proud of. At the 2022 MN state convention, I decided to run for the Junior Holstein Board, where I have grown immensely as a leader. Serving on the board has been an incredible experience. I've grown so much as a leader, first I was a Director and State Show Chair. I was in charge of ordering awards, reaching out to volunteers, coordinating sponsorship, and being the main contact person at the show. Then I was elected as Vice President and Convention Chair, putting me in charge of our annual junior convention. Planning the Minnesota Junior Holstein All-Breeds Convention was a huge challenge, but it taught me how to manage big projects, communicate effectively, and ask for help when needed. This year, as MJHA President, I'm honored to represent an organization that has given me so much.

When I look back on my junior career, I feel so grateful for my registered Holsteins, the places they've taken me, and the incredible connections I've made along the way. My journey started with my first registered Holstein, Circle-Drive Brazzle Melody. She wasn't an All-American or a high-scoring cow, but she made a lasting impact on my life. Together, Melody and I earned four trips to the Minnesota State Fair 4-H encampment. Each trip brought something new—from my first top-ten showmanship placing to a purple ribbon, and finally, our proudest moment: 7th in the Minnesota 4-H Dairy Showcase. That was my first time in the top 10. Showcase is an exceptional program that recognizes and awards the top 4-H dairy youth in the state based on their overall involvement in the dairy project. It's an honor to make it into the showcase. Melody played a large part in me pushing my goals and dreaming of bigger things one day, she got me hooked on showing. This girl and I had an incredible ride and I am so excited to continue her legacy with her daughters and granddaughters.

In 2021, I exhibited Skylar at my first State Holstein Show, where she won her class. I was so excited and over the moon that my hard work over the summer had paid off! Later, she placed 4th open and 2nd junior at the Midwest Fall National. This milestone was made possible by my grandpa's unwavering support and encouragement. Showing cattle opened doors to amazing opportunities, including working at the World Dairy Expo for Discovery Genetics. Nightlining and caring for top-tier cattle deepened my appreciation for the industry and allowed me to build lasting connections. In 2023, I exhibited at the Midwest Fall National and joined forces with Pit-Crew Genetics. There, I learned so much about feeding and caring for show heifers, and I gained a trusted mentor, Tom Foss. His guidance has been invaluable to my growth. From rinsing and walking heifers at his place to helping out at state and national shows, I've cherished every moment. Last year's show season was one for the books, and I'm so thankful to have gained a wonderful show family along the way.

I owe so much of where I am today to the youth organizations I've been fortunate to be part of, and they've taught me that everything truly happens for a reason. Since 2012, I've been an active member of Le Sueur County 4-H. I still remember preparing to show for the first

time as a Cloverbud at the county fair. My heifer, Annie, that I had worked with all year, came down with ringworm just before the show. I was heartbroken, but another family in our club kindly lent me their Jersey spring calf so I could still have my first experience in the ring. (And yes, that was my first and last time showing a Jersey!) Looking back, I realize how that moment shaped my resilience and taught me the value of community. 4-H was the organization that sparked my love for agriculture and leadership. From serving as a club officer to becoming a county ambassador, I've gained countless personal and professional skills that will stay with me for life. It also gave me the chance to dive deeper into my passion for dairy cattle. I competed in Dairy Quiz Bowl for the first time and loved it! My strong memory and quick reactions made it a perfect fit for me, and it fueled my desire to get involved in even more dairy-related activities. At the time, my county didn't have a strong dairy judging program, but luckily, the neighboring county welcomed us to join theirs. Dairy Judging has been the most transformative experience for me. When I started, I was terrified of speaking in front of others, but through judging and giving oral reasons, I gained confidence and grew as a communicator. It became my favorite 4-H activity and taught me how to evaluate cows and articulate my decisions clearly. I've even applied those skills to improve my herd. Dairy Judging has taken me to three different states and allowed me to compete successfully in four national 4-H and FFA contests. Along the way, I've learned that even the challenges and unexpected moments—like ringworm and finding a new judging team—have shaped me into who I am today. Everything really does happen for a reason, and I'm so grateful for the lessons, skills, and friendships I've gained on this journey.

When it came time to search for colleges, the University of Minnesota wasn't my top choice. I grew up hearing my parents' stories about their time at the U and the amazing organizations they were part of, but I couldn't shake the idea of how intimidating the Twin Cities seemed. Coming from a small town of 3,000 people and a graduating class of just 113, the thought of living in a big city was overwhelming. When I toured the U, though, everything changed. Walking onto the St. Paul campus, I immediately felt at ease—it didn't feel like I was in the middle of a busy city. Instead, it felt familiar, welcoming, and a little bit like home. After that visit, I knew I wanted to be a third-generation Gopher. Choosing the University of Minnesota has been one of the best decisions of my life. I've found an amazing community here through organizations like Lambda Delta Phi and Gopher Dairy Club. These groups are full of people like me who are passionate about agriculture and the dairy industry, and they've given me a sense of belonging I didn't expect to find so far from home. Joining the University of Minnesota Dairy Judging team was another choice that felt meant to be. I'm so fortunate to have amazing coaches and teammates who push me to be my best. I've loved every part of the journey—the trips, the incredible cattle, and the inspiring people we've met. Looking back I can see how everything from my parents' stories to that first campus tour led me here for a reason.

My future plans are to work in the dairy industry, focusing on the genetic or reproductive fields as a consultant or analyst. In addition, I also plan to continue developing Montyedge Holsteins and improving my herd of registered cattle. I'm excited to carry on this legacy, striving for excellence and making a positive impact both on my herd and in the broader dairy industry. I truly believe that everything happens for a reason, and as I look ahead, I'm committed to finding the purpose in every opportunity, challenge, and experience that comes my way.



### 2025 MINNESOTA YOUNG DISTINGUISHED JUNIOR MEMBER

For me, the dairy industry is what shapes and teaches me to be the best version of myself I can be and to keep pushing to better myself each day. I have been lucky to grow up within the dairy industry and it has taught me many important life lessons. I believe we should

speak up for what we believe in, and dairy judging as helped me overcome my fear of public speaking. Through chores on the farm, I have learned different ways to apply myself and keep working on being a better version of myself for tomorrow.

Hi, my name is Kamrie Mauer, a 16-year-old who has not always been a part of the dairy industry. In fact, my mom says I didn't like cows until I was around 4 or so. The first calf that sparked my interest was a Brown Swiss calf named Cinderella that was my mom's calf. When I was around the age of 5, there was a Holstein calf at Blasberg Dairy, where my mom worked at feeding calves. I named her Rockstar, and she was the first calf I ever showed at a local county fair.

In 2015 my mom and I moved to Minnesota, where we currently live in McLeod County with my Stepdad, Dan, and my two younger siblings, Bentley, and Harlie. Together we milk a herd of registered Holsteins and Jerseys of which the Holstein BAA is 112.8 earning us second in the region and the jerseys average 90.1 points.

The process of calf management begins with feeding calves in hutches 8 quarts of milk, probiotics, and warm water daily. Healthy calves are typically weaned by three months and moved to weaned pens in groups of three to four, transitioning to grass hay and protein pellets. At eight months, they are relocated to a winter pen for vaccinations or to pasture in summer, remaining

there until they near calving age at 24 months. Pregnant cows are vaccinated a month before calving and fed high-quality cow feed. Post-calving, cows are cared for in box stalls to recover from edema, while calves receive colostrum or supplements for immunity and are moved to clean hutches with fresh bedding.

On our farm my jobs include feeding baby calves, heifers, as well as the show heifers during spring, summer, and fall. By caring for these animals from the day they are born until they calve in, I have learned responsibility and that these animals rely on me to feed them and notice if they are sick or off. The sooner I find they are sick the faster my parents can treat and care for them. This too applies in life, the sooner we can take care of messy situations and communicate about them the better the outcome. Ever year the amount of responsibility I have has increased from when I was 6 and my farm jobs consisted of naming calves and caring for my cat herd.

Throughout caring for these animals, I have been able to learn so many new things and joined some wonderful programs such as Minnesota Jr. Holstein Association (MJHA), 4-H, FFA, and the McLeod County Dairy Royalty program. Because of these programs, I have overcome my fear of public speaking, which used to make me cry. I still get nervous, but these programs have helped me step out of my comfort zone and taught me how to grow and collaborate as a team. I hope to continue to grow and gain confidence in the years to come.

In the Dairy Royalty program, I have to be able to educate to the public on the benefits of dairy as well as the precautions we have to take to ensure that products are safe and healthy. In 4-H, I have gotten better at communication through demonstrations and giving reasons in dairy judging. I have participated on the dairy judging and Conduct of Chapters Meeting teams in FFA. I have learned how to work with various teammates and communication

styles in these different settings. In MJHA, I have participated in dairy quiz bowl and was honored to represent Minnesota at the National Convention Holstein Convention in Kentucky in 2023. Also, because of the Minnesota Junior Holstein Association, I have learned to apply my knowledge in conversations with fellow dairy members and meeting new people, making connections throughout the dairy industry.

I have made many friends by showing at the county, state, and national level. I love showmanship and am competitive. Three years ago, was my second time going to the Minnesota 4-H State Fair. My calf, Fireball and I achieve second place in showmanship and fourth in class, thus securing us a spot for the Rising Star award, a scholarship program honoring Minnesota's top 4-H dairy youth. This was a huge honor, but the best part of the state fair was that I met my best friend, Lindsey Gibbs. Lindsey Gibbs is a once-in-a-lifetime friend. She pushes me to be better in and out of the ring. She won showmanship that year and it was our friendly

competition that led to our friendship.

Recently, I have been taking pictures around the farm of my cattle and really find it fulfilling. I started to take pictures for a 4-H project and have found a passion in it to further promote the dairy industry. Last week I put together an advertisement clip for a heifer my family is selling and had a lot of fun with it. I plan to continue to make video advertisements for sale consignments and hope to make a small business out of it.

Other ways I have been promoting the dairy industry and all the magical properties of milk is with milk soap making. I call it, "Suds in the Bucket." Within this last year, I have made 6 different batches of soap and share it with family and friends. I hope to repurpose the loft in our barn this summer and lead milk soap making classes a few times a year.

Because of the dairy industry, I have found my passion and purpose through communicating with people and representing the amazing dairy cow and all the magic that comes from her.

The farm currently milks 330 high-producing Holstein cows with the help of 5 robotic milkers, and they operate 700 acres of corn, plenish beans, and alfalfa. Their farm is not just a place of hard work but a family endeavor, with their children Brea, Ava, and Bryson playing an integral role in the day-to-day operations, assisting with all areas of the dairy. Beyond farming, Chad works as a full-time dairy nutritionist, and Kendra manages the farm's calves while also working part-time at a local flower shop, ensuring that both family and business are well-balanced. Chad & Kendra would like to recognize Gary and Linda for building the foundation of this dairy and allowing them to build on what they created. Gary is at the farm each day assisting wherever is needed and Linda completes all the bookwork for the farm.

Their current herd is performing exceptionally well, running a 29,163 RHA, with impressive numbers such as 4.35% BF, 3.22% P, 79 SCC, and 33,028 ECM. These figures speak volumes about their expertise in managing and caring for their cows. In addition to these impressive production numbers, Kiefland Holsteins is home to numerous distinguished animals in the show ring, showcasing the farm's commitment to genetic excellence.

Chad and Kendra's dedication to the dairy industry extends beyond their farm. They are highly active in their local community and state organizations, always willing to lend a helping hand to others. As members of the St. Charles FFA Alumni Chapter and 4-H Club Leaders, they are passionate about educating the next generation of dairy farmers and agricultural enthusiasts. were honored as the Winona County Farm Family of the Year, recognizing their contributions to agriculture and their community.

The Kiefland Holsteins breeding program has been equally successful, with seven junior show All-American Nominations and one All-American Nomination to date. One of their most notable animals, Kiefland Prodigy-RED, achieved the prestigious titles of 2024 Red & White Honorable Mention All-American Winter Yearling, Red & White Junior All-American Winter Yearling, and World Dairy Expo Red and White Bred & Owned Junior Champion of the Junior Show. Other recent accolades include the 2023 Red & White Junior Honorable Mention All-American Winter Calf, the 2022 Red & White Junior Honorable Mention All-American Spring Yearling, and the Black & White Junior All-American Winter Calf. The Kieffers' also exhibited the supreme junior champion heifer at the 2023 Midwest Fall National and the junior champion Red & White heifer at the 2024 Midwest Fall National, further solidifying their status in the dairy industry.

Chad and Kendra's show ring success has allowed them to market some of the industry's most sought-after genetics. One of their notable sales includes an Alpha homebred daughter out of Contender Revive, who was named All-Northeast Fall National Fall Calf in 2024. Additionally, they have sold a Hulu daughter out of a 91 Jacot, who was a granddaughter of All-Canadian 95 Errolea Avalanche Brazil, as well as a Hulu granddaughter out of the famous OCD Jordy Lionking-RED from Betley Farms. Their breeding program has led to several collaborations with renowned cow families such as Kingsway Jasmine, Kingsway Arangatang, Windbrook Lynzi, OCD Candy, Kings Ransom Clash, Weeks Dundee Anika, Peticlerc Anouk, Caught Your Eye, Lucky Rose, Apple, Pine Tree Fraz, Errolea Brazil, Triple T Paige, Jacobs Goldwyn Lisamaree, Jacobs Goldwyn Valana, and Macland Yoder, among others.

Chad & Kendra Kieffer stand as models of excellence in both genetics and farm management. Their unwavering dedication to improving their herd, advancing the dairy industry, and contributing to their local community is truly exemplary. The Kieffers' leadership, both in the show ring and within their local agricultural organizations, shows their commitment to innovation, education, and sustainability.





McAndrews Dairy LLC, located near Sauk Centre, Minnesota, is a family-owned dairy farm with a long history in Holstein farming. The farm's roots trace back to Joe McAndrews, who grew up on a registered Holstein farm near Rosemount, and Betty McAndrews, from a dairy farm in Jordan. Their shared passion for agriculture led them to establish their own dairy farm in 1975 in Jordan, raising registered Holstein cow families from Joe's family farm. After 23 years, the McAndrews family sold most of their cows in 1998 but remained committed to agriculture. Their son Michael, after working on large dairies in California and Minnesota, established his own herd in 2001 by leasing a 70-cow barn. In 2006, Joe and Betty joined Michael, forming McAndrews Dairy LLC at the current location near Sauk Centre. In 2008, Michael married Kate Fessenden, an animal nutritionist from New York, adding expertise to the family operation. Today, McAndrews Dairy LLC milks around 430 registered Holsteins three times a day in a double 16 parlor and maintains 900 acres of corn, alfalfa, beans, and cover crops.

McAndrews Dairy LLC has seen significant growth in herd production. In 2007, the farm milked 233 cows, with an average of 24,291 pounds of milk, 867 pounds of fat, and 743 pounds of protein. By 2024, production increased to 28,665 pounds of milk, 1,171 pounds of fat, and 882 pounds of protein, with a somatic cell count of 102. The farm focuses on improving genetics, type, and production, with some exceptional cow families. One family includes a 93 point dam 4E, with six daughters classified at 94, 93, 92, 90, and 88 points.

McAndrews Dairy LLC has a strong presence in the show ring, primarily through 4-H. Over the years, the family has achieved multiple successes, including Joe's 1960s wins at the Minnesota State Fair, where he took home the 4-H Champion, Reserve Champion, and Showmanship Champion titles. Michael, Jason, Mary, and Kim also participated in the state fair, and more recently, the family has leased animals that have placed first and second in 4-H shows.

In 2024, when the state Holstein show was held in Stearns County, youth exhibitors Mary and Luke McAndrews, Avery Rieland, and Caleb Miller participated, showing heifers in the junior, red and white, and Holstein shows. Mary earned the Supreme Junior Champion award at Dairy Days. McAndrews Dairy LLC was named Premier Exhibitor and Breeder at the district Show, with three animals exhibited at the Minnesota State Fair open show.

The McAndrews family is actively involved in their community and the dairy industry. Michael and Kate serve on the Stearns County Holstein Board, which hosted the state Holstein shows in 2024 and 2015. Kate also serves on the Stearns Farm Bureau and various church committees. Joe and Betty were involved in the Scott County Fair Board, the Scott County Holstein Board, and the Scott County ADA Board, among other community groups. The family has hosted numerous farm tours and dairy judging sessions and has all been active 4-H leaders.

In 2024, McAndrews Dairy LLC was awarded the First District Quality Milk Award, recognizing their commitment to high-quality milk production. The family strives to improve the herd in genetics and management, believing in the simple philosophy & take good care of the cow, and the cow will take care of you.

The past 18 years have been filled with challenges and growth, from financial planning to strategic decision-making. Despite the ups and downs, the family remains passionate about dairy farming, enjoying the process of developing cow families, watching young animals grow, and seeing youth exhibitors succeed at local fairs.


